ERASMUS

The Erasmus+ Program

The European Region Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students is a part of the EU's Lifelong Learning Program. The main goal is to promote cooperation between universities and student mobility. The focus points include the simplification of the recognition of academic achievements provided abroad, as well as the financial support of study or internship stays abroad.

Grant amounts

Depending on the destination, the funding amounts are between 390 and 490 euros per month (as of 2022). Additional funding for travel costs or language courses can be requested from the CUAS International Relations Office.

Participating countries

Member States of the European Union, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey, Republic of Macedonia and Serbia (as of 2021). If necessary, a request for co-financing for stays in non-Erasmus countries can also be examined in the IRO.

Eligible person

All regular CUAS students who have completed at least the first year of study.





 - For Winter semester 30 April incl. all signed documents



ERASMUS+ SPECIAL NEEDS SUPPORT

Students with special needs

Erasmus+ takes inclusion very seriously. Students with a disability or chronic illness can apply for additional financial aid to cover any additional costs that might arise due to their stay abroad.

Students with children

Students who take their own children with them abroad as part of an Erasmus + stay can apply for a special grant in the form of a monthly lump sum.

Students who study part-time

Students who study part-time can take the opportunity to take educational leave to complete a semester abroad. The application for educational leave must be clarified individually with the employer. Simultaneous receipt of an Erasmus grant and funding for educational leave from the Public Employment Service Austria is permitted.

Study grant

Study grants can be granted for the duration of the Erasmus+ stay abroad continue to be obtained, if the student basically to the full extent for study and examination operations is approved in Austria.
