The Erasmus+ Program

The European Region Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students is a part of the EU's Lifelong Learning Program. The main goal is to promote cooperation between universities and student mobility. The focus points include the simplification of the recognition of academic achievements provided abroad, as well as the financial support of study or internship stays abroad.

Grant amounts

Depending on the destination, the funding amounts are between 540 and 640 euros per month (as of 2022).

Additional funding for a language course can be requested from the CUAS International Relations Office.

Participating countries

Member States of the European Union, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey, Republic of Macedonia and Serbia (as of 2022).

PROCEDURE

To apply for an Erasmus+ grant, please complete the following steps:

Before your internship:

- Acceptance of an internship (obligatory or voluntary), which is recognized by CUAS.
- Period of stay must be between 2 and 12 months in one of the participating countries.
- Submission of the completed and signed documents on Moodle at least six weeks before the start of your internship!

All of the required documents and detailed information are available in the Moodle course. You will receive all the exact details for the enrollment from the International Relations Office. Please send us an email at international@cuas.at to receive access to the course.

INTERNSHIP AFTER YOUR GRADUATION?

With the Erasmus+ program it is also possible to apply for financial support after graduation. This is possible if, e.g the same requirements for the Eramus+ internship are met: Submission of documents on time, internship in one of the participating countries, minimal duration of 2 months. However, please note the following additional factors:

- The nomination for the Erasmus grant has to be completed while you are still enrolled at CUAS.
- The internship has to be completed within 12 months after your graduation.

During each study cycle (bachelor, master), you are entitled to a total of 12 months of Erasmus funding. If you have already received an Erasmus+ grant, the funding period will be reduced. For example: if you received funding for a semester abroad (three months) and an internship abroad (four months) during the bachelor's program, there is still five months of funding available for the graduate internship.

ERASMUS+ SPECIAL NEEDS SUPPORT

Students with special needs

Erasmus+ takes inclusion very seriously. Students with a disability or chronic illness can apply for additional financial aid to cover any additional costs that might arise due to their stay abroad.

Students with children

Students who take their own children with them abroad as part of an Erasmus+ stay can apply for a special grant in the form of a monthly lump sum.
